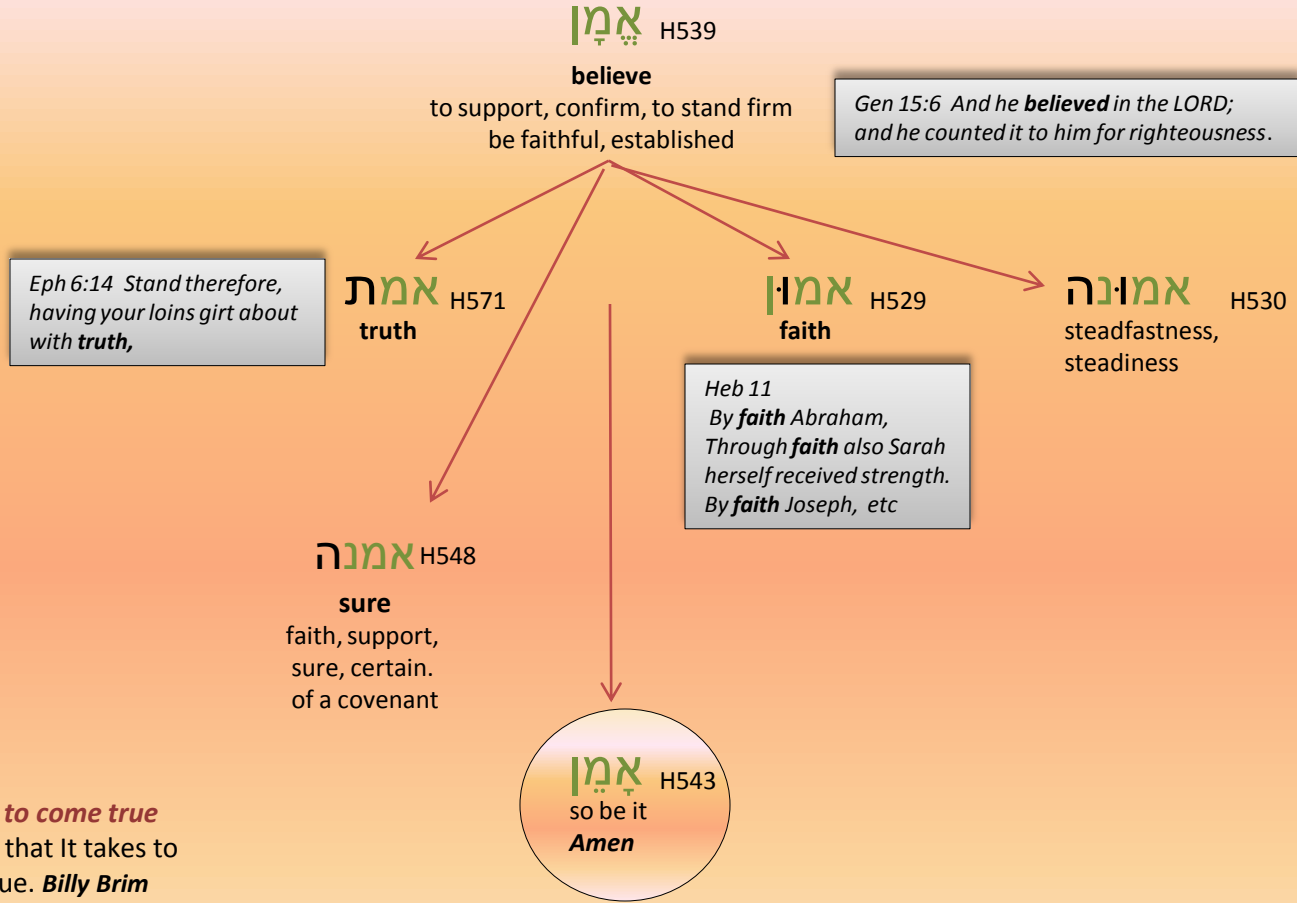


The Hebrew root has 3 consonants *usually*. We now come to the central theme of all word building in Hebrew; it is the central rhythm of the whole vast far flung structure of the Hebrew language. Practically all words in Hebrew go back to a root and this root must have in it 3 consonants. You can do anything you want to the root, you can use it in any verb form or tense, you can turn it to nouns, adverbs, prepositions, adjectives. No matter what you do you will see always staring you in the face? The 3 constants of the root, you can never escape them and equally important, what you do with the root, no matter in to what word you turn it, that word must carry in it something of the meaning of the root.

אמן
'âman
aw-man'

A primitive root; properly to *build up or support; to foster as a parent or nurse; figuratively to render (or be) firm or faithful, to trust or believe, to be permanent or quiet; morally to be true or certain; once (in Isa 30:21; by interchange for H541) to go to the right hand: - hence assurance, believe, bring up, establish, + fail, be faithful (of long continuance, steadfast, sure, surely, trusty, verified), nurse, (-ing father), (put), trust, turn to the right.*

Feminine of H543; something *fixed, that is, a covenant, an allowance: - certain portion, sure.*

H543 AMEN

אמן
'âmên
aw-mane'

From H539; *sure; abstractly faithfulness; adverbially truly: - Amen, so be it, truth.*

H530

אמונה
'ëmûnâh 'ëmûnâh
em-oo-naw', em-oo-naw'

Feminine of H529; literally *firmness; figuratively security; moral fidelity: - faith (-ful, -ly, -ness, [man]), set office, stability, steady, truly, truth, verily.*

H529

אמון
'êmûn
ay-moon'

From H539; *established, that is, (figuratively) trusty; also (abstractly) trustworthiness: - faith (-ful), truth.*

H571 TRUTH

אמת
'emeth
eh'-meth

Contracted from H539; *stability; figuratively certainty, truth, trustworthiness: - assured (-ly), establishment, faithful, right, sure, true (-ly, -th), verity.*
